# Whisky

## **What about that smoke?**

*Smoke is a big part of what makes Scottish whisky stand out. The smoky aroma and flavor come from the peat smoke seeping into the barley as it's dried. Different distilleries have their own methods, so some whiskies are lightly peated, with a hint of a smoky undertone, while others are heavily peated, with bold, briny, and earthy flavors. The smoky character can add complexity, giving the whisky a tangy, medicinal, or even seaside feel.*

*Like many things, it was driven by necessity - firewood is scarce on the islands and peat is widely available, years of that and it became tradition. Even if you're not a big fan of smoke, there are plenty of whiskies with just a touch of it, balanced beautifully with other flavors.*

## **What about that oak?**

*Oak is a necessary part of Scottish whisky. Legally, you can't call it scottish whisky if it wasn't matured for three years in oak barrels on Scottish soil. As the whisky ages in oak barrels, it absorbs flavors from that wood, mellowing out in process.*

*Different types of oak, like American or European, add their own special touches. American oak barrels usually bring out sweet notes like vanilla and coconut, making the whisky rich and smooth. European oak, on the other hand, often adds spicier, tannic flavors, along with dried fruit and sometimes a bit of a tannic bite.*

*American oak usually comes in form of casks that used to hold bourbon. And we need to thank sherry industry in Spain for majority of european oak. But use of different barrels that used to hold rum, port, madeira, cognac, wine are becoming increasingly popular.*

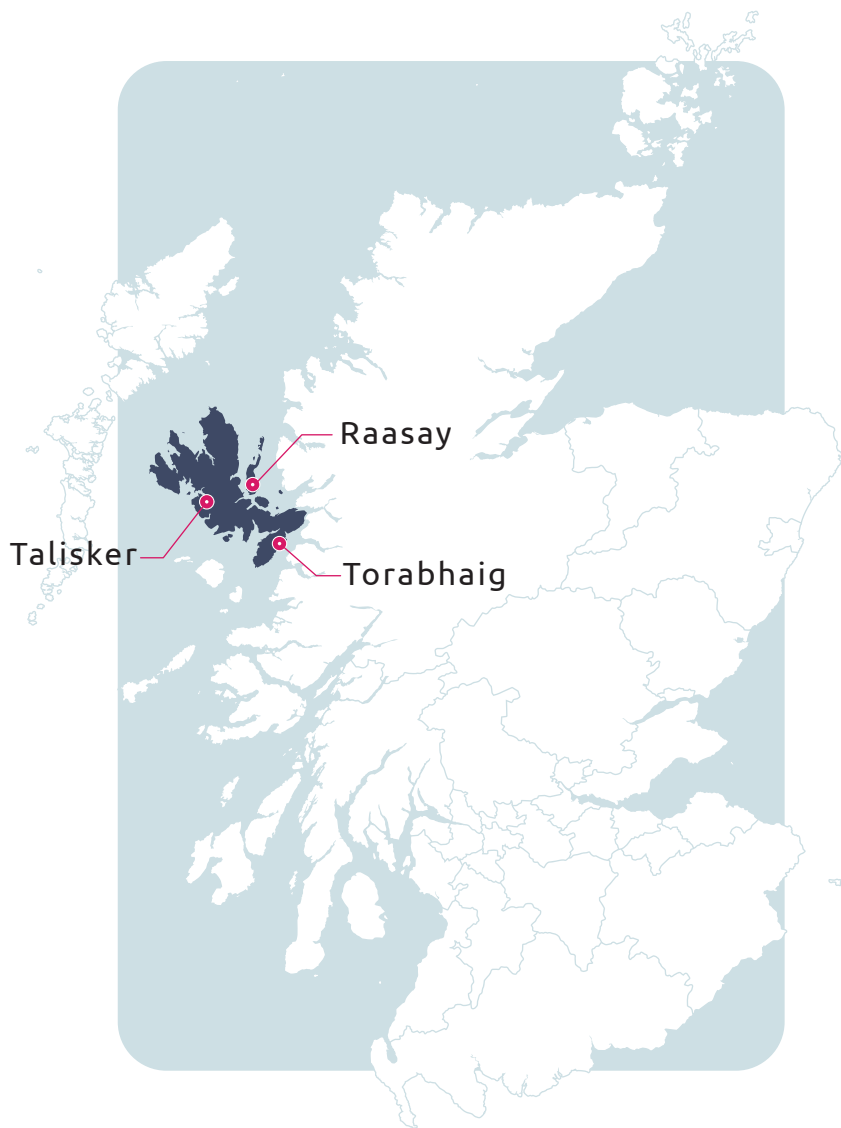
## **Raasay Marsala Cask Finish, 50.7%**

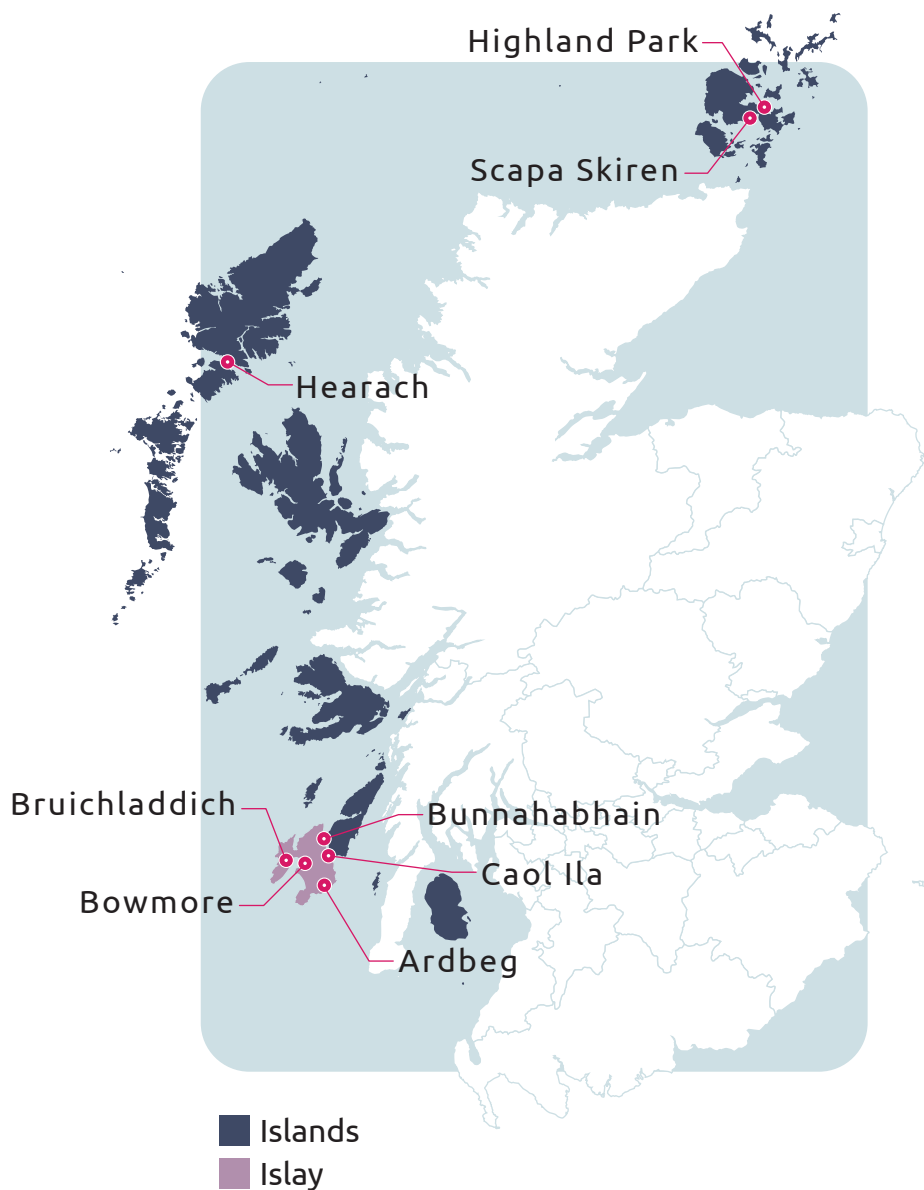

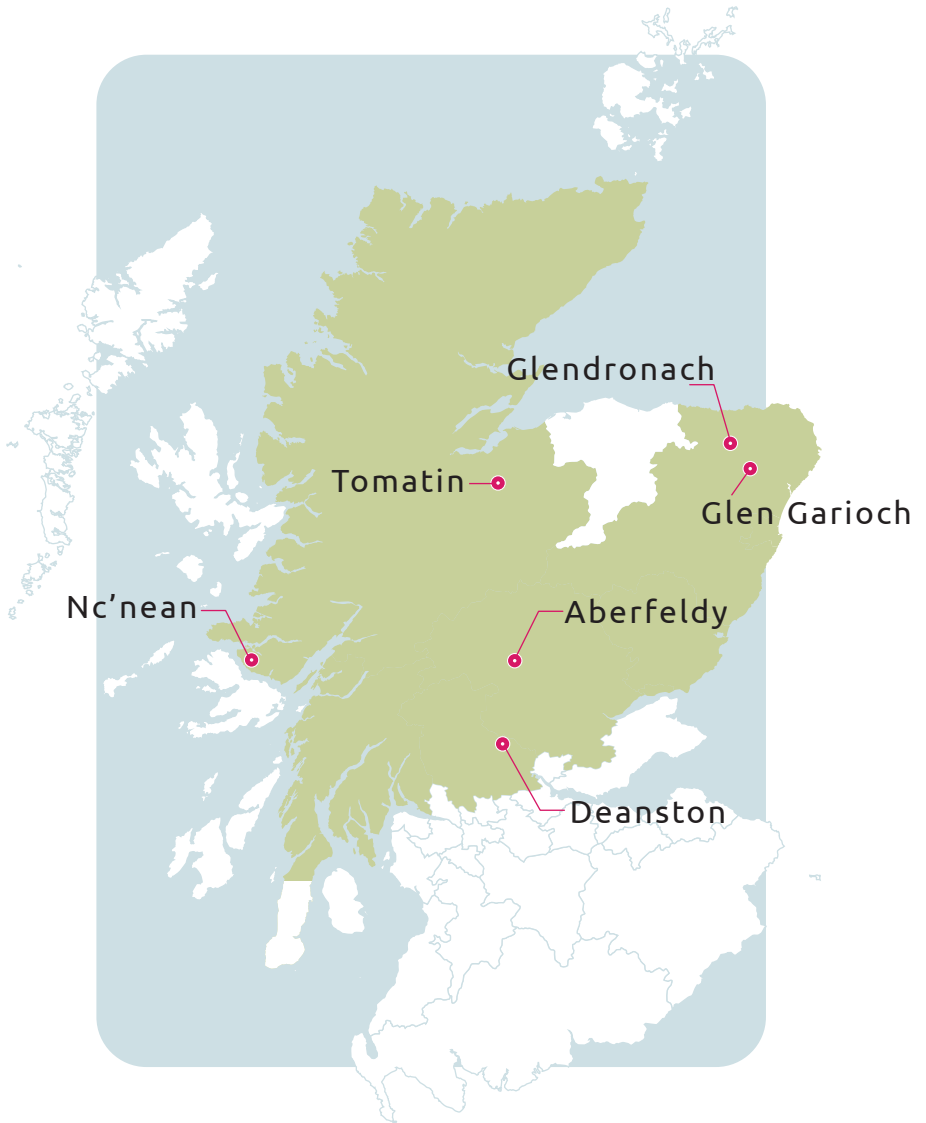
